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Program Accreditation and Program Outcomes

In accordance with CORE standard A.5, the Langston University Rehabilitation Counseling Program (RCP) provides information routinely to the public on its performance including, but not limited to, student enrollment, graduates, accreditation status, and student achievement consistent with policies of the institution, to foster continuing public awareness and confidence about academic quality. Program Accreditation Status:

The RCP is fully accredited by the Council on Rehabilitation Education (CORE) through 2013, www.core-rehab.org. The RCP is administered through the Department of Rehabilitation Counseling and Disability Studies (DRCDS), which also houses an Undergraduate Rehabilitation Services Program (RSP) and a Master's of Science Degree in Visual Services Program (VRSP).

Average Time/Matriculation Period:

24 months if student enrolled in 12 credit-hours in semesters 1, 2, & 4, and 6 credit-hours in semesters 3 & 5, totaling 48 credit-hours.

Special Note: Students may matriculate through RCP courses on their own pace. RCP courses are normally scheduled only once an academic year.

Estimated Program Cost:

Resident (\$13,295) Nonresident (\$21,093)

Special Note: Estimated program cost does not include textbook and additional peripheral course materials.

Rehabilitation Services Administration Scholarship (RSA) Availability:

Academic Year 2013-2014 two (2) RSA Scholarship are available.

RCP Graduate Employment Rate:

Employment rate of RCP graduates within the first six (6) months following graduation is 94%.

RCP Graduates' Employment Settings:

Rehabilitation counselors practice in both the public and private sectors. Examples of settings in which RCP graduates are currently employed include, but not limited to:

- State-Federal Rehabilitation Programs
- Mental Health Centers
- Private, Non-Profit, Community-based Organizations
- Public School Systems
- Private Rehabilitation Companies
- Colleges and Universities
- Correctional Facilities
- Medical Centers/Hospitals
- Private Practice
- Job Training Centers
- Substance Abuse Facilities

In addition to serving people with physical disabilities, RCP graduates work with a variety of other populations including individuals with developmental, cognitive, emotional, and addiction disabilities, as well as persons preparing for future careers.

Eligibility for National Certification and Licensure by RCP Program Graduates:

RCP courses are designed to develop mastery of knowledge and skill areas identified by the Council on Rehabilitation Education (CORE) as requisite competencies for rehabilitation counselors. The RCP strives to mold scholars who apply research/literature, statistical and research methods to guide practice. Students who successfully complete the program coursework are eligible to apply for national certification as a Certified Rehabilitation Counselor through the Commission on Rehabilitation Counselor Certification (CRCC).

Professional Counselor (LPC) track option is offered through the Graduate Program in Rehabilitation Counseling. In addition to the completion of the 48 credit-hour CORE

accredited Rehabilitation Counseling Program (RCP) curriculum, students will have the option of completing an additional 12 credit-hours under the Licensed Professional Counselors (LPC) track option. Students who have completed the 48 credit-hour RCP and the 12 credit-hour LPC option track (a total of 60 credit-hours) will be eligible to make application to the Oklahoma State Department of Health (OSDH) to become an Licensed Professional Counselor.
