## Liberal Education

## Program Overview

The Bachelor of Arts in Liberal Education (B.A.L.E.) degree is a general studies plan that offers personal freedom and flexibility in choosing 6 majors areas, plus the core capstone colloquia. The colloquia culminate in an independent study related to a professional or academic area of the student's interest. This program is designed to serve those who have completed two years at a community college or completed general education requirements at a 4 -year college. The degree may be completed in 12 months. Students have the opportunity to take courses in most all the academic areas for professional and personal growth.

A liberal arts degree satisfies career options that require a non-specific degree. With general studies, students who are in career tracks with promotion opportunities will find the degree an excellent choice. The approach is liberal in that it allows a broad spectrum of academic areas to be explored. Students may also use this degree in preparation for graduate school.

Graduates have a variety of career options in law, business, military, social and government services. Graduates are employed in non-profit organizations, in U.S. Civil and Foreign Services, and in education with alternative teaching certificates.

## Admissions Requirements

- Completed Admission Application from Langston University-Tulsa
- A minimum of 48 transferable college credit hours
- A minimum 2.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale
- All official transcripts from previous college(s)
- With an Associate of Arts and an Associate of Science degree from an Oklahoma college, all general education requirements are completed; Applied Science degrees from some institutions may not be fully articulated


## Degree Requirements

- 124 credit hours
- A maximum of 64 of these hours may be earned at a junior college
- Additional hours from a 4-year university may be used to complete degree
- A cumulative grade point average of 2.00 or higher is required for graduation
- 30 credit hour residency (Must be taken at Langston University)
- Enrollment at Langston University-Tulsa required the semester of intended graduation


## Required Core Courses

- ED 4012 Colloquium: Research Writing
- ED 4022 Colloquium: Communication in Media
- ED 4032 Colloquium: American Contemporary Issues
- ED 4042 Colloquium: International Issues
- ED 4003 Independent Study in professional academic area
*Grades of "C" or better are required for core courses


## Major Courses

- 36 hours of upper division hours in 6 academic areas of student's choice
- Minimum of 6 hours (of the 36 hours) in Arts \& Sciences
- 6 academic areas (of the 36 hours) may include, but are not limited to:

Accounting, Business Administration, Computer Science, Corrections, Criminal Justice, Economics, Education, Finance, History, Humanities, Information Systems, Management, Marketing, Psychology, Sociology, Special Education, Organizational Leadership, Health Care Administration, Library Science, Rehabilitation Services

- 18 hours (of the 36 hours) must carry the 4000 course level in addition to the BALE courses
- 15 hours of electives may be needed to complete 124 hours
*Grades of " $C$ " or better are required for major courses
