



## Rehabilitation Services

### Program Overview

The Bachelor of Science in Rehabilitation Services introduces theories and methods of intervention in the field of rehabilitation. The program prepares the student to work at a level of competency and understanding with persons with disability in the community. The student will develop an awareness of the social, psychological, economic, physical, medical, and environmental needs of people with disabilities as they seek vocational rehabilitation services.

The student preparing for the degree in rehabilitation services should be able to provide services for people with disability, evaluate assistive technology, apply basic counseling techniques, and conduct and evaluate basic research. The program prepares students who seek to advance into the management role in the field of vocational rehabilitation and independent living. The program is designed in accordance with the Council on Rehabilitation Education (CORE) Undergraduate Registry standards. The degree also prepares the students to pursue studies in graduate rehabilitation counseling and general counseling. Internships in rehabilitation services direct students toward several areas of emphasis and interest.

### Admissions Requirements

- ❑ Completed Admission Application from Langston University-Tulsa
- ❑ A minimum of 48 transferable college credit hours
- ❑ A minimum 2.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale
- ❑ All official transcripts from previous college(s)
- ❑ With an Associate of Arts and an Associate of Science degree from an Oklahoma college, all general education requirements are completed; Applied Science degrees from some institutions may not be fully articulated

### Degree Requirements

- ❑ 124 credit hours
- ❑ A maximum of 64 of these hours may be earned at a junior college
- ❑ 30 credit hour residency (Must be taken at Langston University)
- ❑ Must be enrolled at Langston University-Tulsa the semester of intended graduation
